


## Cost of Attendance and Financial Aid

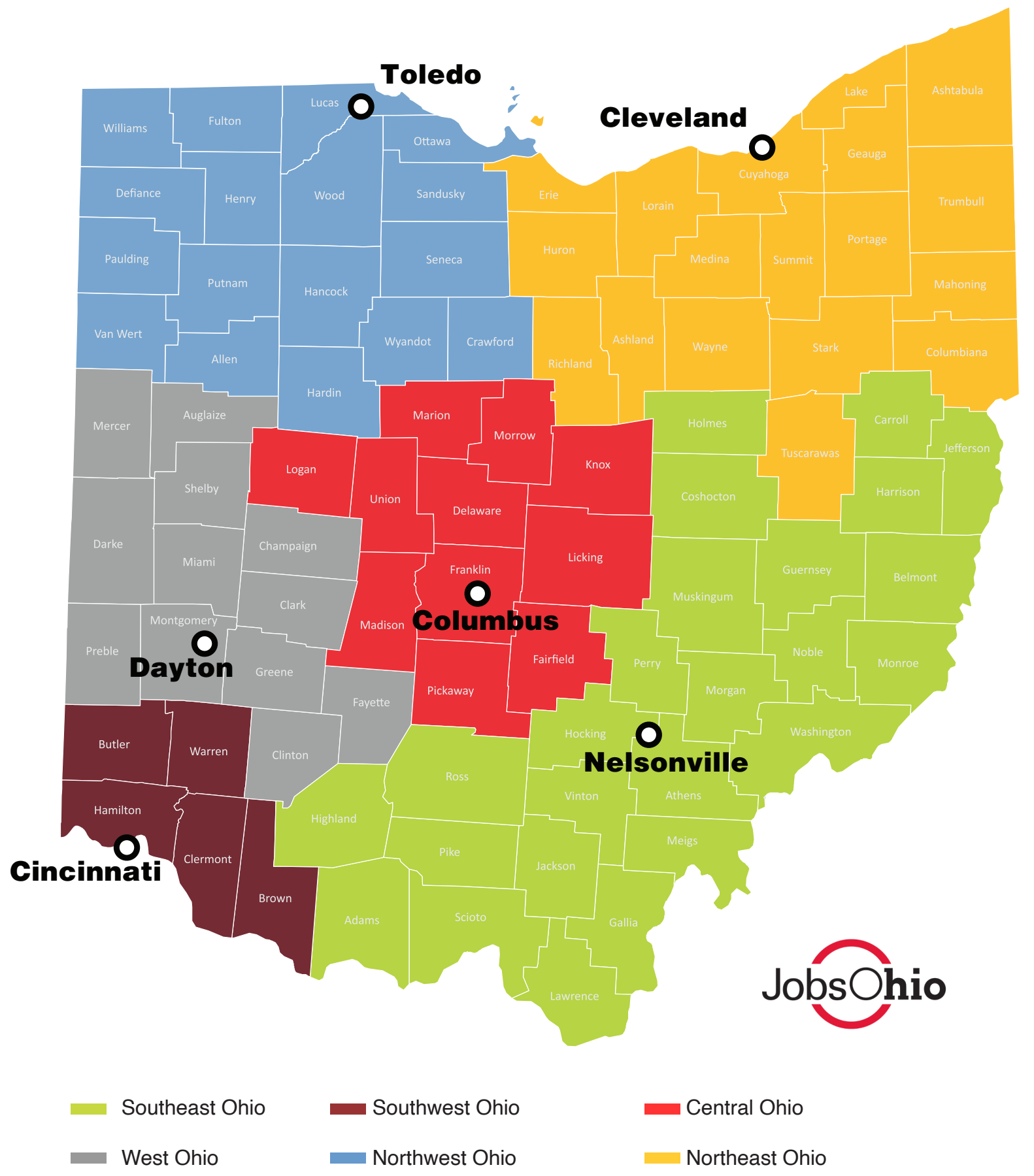
Cost of attendance (COA) is a much more robust measure of the actual costs to attend a higher education institution; these costs include:

## Return on Education Beyond High School

This graph captures earnings 10 years after initial enrollment for former students who are working and not enrolled in school during the measurement period. The median, 75th percentile, and 25th percentile of earnings for former students by institution are displayed. Aggregated earnings are reported for all regional and main campuses of a university. Threshold 0, the orange bar, was defined as the minimum economic return to see earnings over time that would be above what an individual who only completed high school received and considers the cost of post-secondary education. Threshold 0 was not available for most Ohio Technical Centers because net price was not available in the dataset.
